### TIERED PRICING

Summer camp is a positive life changing experience for many children and youth. We believe that every child should be able to come to camp, which is why we offer tiered pricing. Lakeshore summer camps are a great value! We are proud to say that all of our basic camp programs are priced under the regional average price.



You may be surprised to learn that the rates Lakeshore has historically charged are subsidized and well below the true cost of a week at camp. Camps across the country are receiving fewer and fewer subsidies, and Lakeshore is no exception. In order to continue to offer the same great programming with new and improved activities, rates would need to increase drastically. Rather than raise prices on all families, tiered pricing essentially asks families with greater financial means to consider picking a tier more closely resembling the direct cost of camp. This honor system approach makes it financially possible for any child to come to camp.

Tiered pricing is intended to allow families to select the level of payment most appropriate for their circumstances. Each family may



freely choose to participate in TIER 1, TIER 2 or TIER 3 level of payment. Every camper has the same experience regardless of the chosen tier and only the office will know who chose which payment level. Lakeshore believes that every child should be able to come to camp and will continue to offer camperships for campers who need greater financial assistance.

#### An explanation of the three tiers:

**TIER 1: TRUE** – For families who are blessed to be able to pay first tier pricing, this tier more accurately reflects the true cost of camp including all aspects of maintaining facilities in good condition, insurance, utilities, etc. By choosing this tier, you can help Lakeshore make needed upgrades and continue to grow in the future.

**TIER 2: INTERMEDIATE** – This tier is a mid-level between our historically subsidized rate and the true cost of camp. This tier more closely reflects the direct costs of a week of camp, including program costs, food, summer staff and camp administration.

**TIER 3: HISTORICALLY SUBSIDIZED** – This tier most closely matches our traditional fee structure, which has been subsidized. This rate does not reflect what it "really costs" to offer camp programs. Because we want to make every effort to keep the cost of camp as affordable as possible, Tier 3 will keep the historically subsidized rate.

#### **Our Goals for Tiered Pricing:**

- To offer the highest quality programs possible, providing opportunities for fun, fellowship, inspiration and adventure.
- To make camp affordable for all income levels.
- To preserve camp for generations to come.
- To provide an opportunity for partnership with those in a position to further the impact of Lakeshore's summer ministry.

Again, please note that this program is voluntary and in no way influences the experience children receive, yet it offers the opportunity for families to take an active role in supporting the true cost of their child's camp experience.

#### **PRIMARY ELEMENTARY\***

#### TREEHOUSE WILDERNESS CAMPS

Set out on a wilderness adventure and join one of Lakeshore's most popular camps. Campers sleep in platform tents on top of a high hill overlooking the forest and river below. While the main wilderness site is

rustic (no electricity or running water), there is a composting bathroom on-site and a bathhouse with showers at the bottom of the hill. This camp is limited to 26 which allows campers and leadership to build a tight knit community in just one short week. The week is full of outdoor adventures such as climbing the High ropes course, zooming over the trees on a zipline and exploring parts of Lakeshore very few people see.

### **CAMP HOPE** SERIES



Lakeshore offers a series of camp programs designed to meet the specific needs of children and youth living on the edges. These programs are NOT designed to be a psychoanalytical counseling experience, but a time of building community and bearing witness to the hope of God's dependable and unconditional love. These camps are offered without a fee, however, persons or organizations wishing to fund the cost of these camps may do so at a fee of \$360 per camper. To ensure more families can be served through this program,

each camper is permitted to attend two weeks only.We prefer that a camper attend two different type sessions – for example, one Teen Hope and one Camp Peace but not two Camp Peace sessions.

#### **ELEMENTARY CAMP HOPE**

June 30–July 3

This camp session is a Christ-centered, spiritually empowering 4-day/3-night summer camp experience for children (ages 8–12) with past or present exposure to alcohol and/or drug abuse. Surrounded with the usual wonders of Lakeshore, this time of recreation, friendship and Bible-based fun is intended to lead campers to an awareness of love and acceptance we all enjoy in God's kingdom. (This camp is limited to 24 females and 24 males. Check-in is Sun. at 7pm; check-out is Wed. at 11am.).

This camp addresses the needs of children and youth in our society who respond to everyday situations and problems with aggressive behavior. Camp staff will help youth learn ways to short-circuit their tendency toward violent responses, while helping campers develop effective problem solving skills that enable them to avoid confrontation. Add in all the fun and wonder of Lakeshore's normal camp activities, the opportunity to develop new friendships and the beauty of God's fabulous creation and you have all the elements of a life changing week.

#### **HOW ARE CABIN ASSIGNMENTS MADE?**

Most cabins have a maximum of 12 campers with 2 counselors. For the best camping experience, we will place a **maximum of 4 campers** that know each other in the same cabin. While we seek to honor your wishes, we also value kids making new friends.

#### WHERE DOES MY CHILD SLEEP?

All campers, except those that attend a wilderness camp, will sleep in cabins that have air conditioning and bathrooms located in the cabin. Wilderness campers sleep in a rustic (no electricity) outdoor area with canvas tents that sleep 8 set up on wooden platforms —bath house is located some distance from the wilderness area but there is an outhouse located at the wilderness site.

#### HOW DO I CONTACT MY CHILD?

You are welcome to send your camper mail or care packages. Be sure and put your camper's first and last name and mail to Lakeshore Camp, 1458 Pilot Knob Rd, Eva, TN 38333. Please do not send a cell phone with your camper. Having the ability to contact friends and family at home all throughout the week has a tendency to break down community and keep some campers from having a complete camp experience.

#### WHAT CAN BE SENT IN CARE PACKAGES?

It is always good to send something that the camper can share with their cabin mates—this makes everyone excited for someone in their cabin to get a package. Fun ideas are stickers, glow sticks, balloons, etc. Please do not send gum or silly string. If you send candy please avoid any type of peanut product.

#### WHAT ABOUT EMAIL?

Lakeshore has partnered with a company called "Bunk1" to enable campers to receive one-way emails. (There is a fee for this service and a portion of these sales goes into Lakeshore's scholarship fund). These emails are delivered at lunch each day beginning on the first full day of a camper's week, with the final email being delivered during Friday lunch. Information about this service is available at the Lakeshore website lakeshorecamp.org or by calling the camp office at 731-584-6102.

### WHEN DOES MY CAMPER CHECK

**IN AND OUT?** A complete listing of all check in and check out times are available at lakeshorecamp.org.

#### WHAT IF MY CHURCH IS PAYING A Portion of the fee?

For a paper registration: there are two sections that must be completed. You will indicate how much your church has agreed to pay on the payment portion of the form. There is an additional section with church billing information that must be completed and signed by a church official. For online registration: on the payment screen there will be a "church charge" option. Indicate how much of the camp fee the church is paying and then you will be asked for credit card information for your portion of the fee.

#### DOES MY CHILD NEED TO EAT LUNCH/SUPPER BEFORE CHECK-IN?

Yes. The first meal served for camps checking in on Sunday night is Monday breakfast. The first meal served for camps checking in on Monday afternoon is Monday dinner.

#### **IS THERE A NURSE ON SITE?**

Each week Lakeshore has a volunteer RN on site to assist our summer firstaid staff person.

#### **REGISTER ONLINE**

Go to the lakeshore website at **lakeshorecamp.org**. Click on the summer camp tab and choose "Registration." Payment can be made by either VISA or Mastercard. When you complete your registration, it will be downloaded the next day at the Lakeshore office. You will receive two emails concerning your registration—one that will confirm that your registration has been submitted and a 2nd one from the Lakeshore office with specific information about your camp session. Installment payment options available.

#### **REGISTER BY MAIL**

Complete the enclosed registration (be sure and fill out the medical information on the back page). Payment can be either by check (payable to Lakeshore camp) or credit card (VISA or Mastercard). If your church is paying a portion or your entire camp fee, be sure and provide all the requested church information. Lakeshore's mailing address is 1458 Pilot Knob Rd, Eva, TN 38333. If there is not a paper registration included you can download one at lakeshorecamp.org or call the camp office at 731-584-6102 for one to be mailed to you.

#### **REGISTER BY FAX**

Fax your completed registration form (don't forget the medical information on the back) to 731-584-2267. Payment must be made in full with a VISA or Mastercard.

Registration is on a first-come, first-serve basis. Register early to ensure the best chance of getting the camp of your choice.

#### **FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE**

Lakeshore Camp is pleased to offer scholarship assistance to families with need. These funds are very limited. In order to allow these funds to assist more families, the maximum scholarship amount offered is  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the total camp fee and only two of these scholarships per family. Scholarship forms are available by contacting the Lakeshore office at 731-584-6102.

#### CONFIRMATION

Upon receiving your completed registration form and payment, you will be sent a confirmation letter or email. #### **CANCELLATION POLICY**

Cancellations received 30 days prior to your camp start date will receive a full refund minus a \$25 processing fee. Cancellations received within 7 days of the registered camp are not eligible for a refund.
